This phrase was absolutely drilled into their heads. And now when I meet new French people, they understand right away that I'm not French. Even though my name is Michelle, I have a really big accent. They are very quick to tell me, "Oh, I'm sorry I don't speak English, but what I can say is, 'Where is Brian? He's in the kitchen!'" And then they laugh. So, it's kind of like the French community's own private joke.

Basically, anyone who went to school in the 80's and 90's and was learning English, they know these phrases. And there was a comedian who made this really popular or really famous because he did a skit.

He talks about how he learned English as a child at school and how he was traumatized, and he knows he's not the only one who was traumatized. Because if you wanted to learn English, you needed to know where Brian was in this house. You needed to know where Brian's family was in this house. It was absolutely hilarious, so this is like a point of reference in French culture.

So after being stuck in the kitchen for more than 35 years, we're trying to liberate Brian so he can go into the mountains and learn some new vocabulary. Because when you're learning a new language, often you learn the basics, which is great, but you don't learn about mountain activity vocabulary. You don't learn about technical vocabulary.

We're trying to help Brian expand his horizons a little bit. And we're having fun with that.
